



Exporting vehicles from the Netherlands within the EU

1. Come to the auction location

After the employee of Troostwijk Auctions has checked your payment, you can get the documents and number plates that are required to export your vehicle to another country within the European Union.

2. Then go to a RDW inspection station or the RDW customer service

When you want to export a vehicle to another country, the vehicle has to be deregistered in the Netherlands. For the deregistration, you need to bring:

- A valid ID
- The car registration certificates ('Tenaamstellingsbewijs' and 'Overschrijvingsbewijs')
- The number plates from the vehicle(s)
- The chassis number(s).

3. Get a certificate of export

You can get a certificate of export at the RDW inspection station or at the customer service of the RDW. You have to hand over the plates and the registration certificates. Once the export is approved of, you will get an original export declaration (white), a copy (green) and a stamped certificate. When you come back to the location, our employee will ask you for the copy (green) and the stamped certificate. After this procedure you can take the vehicle.

4. Export number plates

If you intend to drive the bought vehicle out of the Netherlands yourself, you will be in need of temporary export number plates. Without these number plates, you cannot use the vehicle in the Netherlands. Attention! To be able to drive the vehicle with the temporary number plates, you must have a liability insurance and a approved MOT for the Vehicle.

The costs for export

5. The other country

It is possible to get a homologation declaration at the local authorities. It shows the technical details of the car. The declaration can also be requested at the RDW (available in several languages). Instead of an approval certificate you can also require a Certificate of Conformity (Certificaat van Overeenstemming). This shows that the car complies with the European standards.
